An unflinching look at the #FeesMustFall student movement that began at the University of Witwatersrand in 2015, then burst onto the South African political landscape as a protest over the cost of education, and morphed into the most militant national revolt since the country's first democratic elections in 1994. Challenging traditional power structures it rages against fundamental inequalities. Protests on these issues continue today.

Its imagery inspired Beyonce's 'Lemonade' video.

Belief in the value of freedom of expression and in the importance of film is palpable in this compelling film.
